Representative Snyder Begins Second Term in the Legislature

Rep. Snyder inaugurated, looks forward to bipartisan lawmaking

Madison... Representative Patrick Snyder (Schofield) took the oath of office to begin his second term as Representative for the 85th Assembly District on Monday. Following the Inauguration Ceremony, Representative Snyder made the following statement:

“I am honored to have been chosen by my friends and neighbors in the 85th Assembly District to represent them in Madison during the 104th Legislature of the State Assembly. It is now more important than ever that we reach across the aisle to come to bipartisan solutions for the people of Wisconsin. I look forward to working with my colleagues in the legislature and Governor Evers to continue moving our great state forward.”

In December, Representative Snyder was selected by Assembly Speaker Robin Vos to serve as Chairman of the Committee on Children and Families for the 2019-2020 legislative session. Rep. Snyder added,

“I am particularly excited for the upcoming session, as I will begin serving as Chairman of the Committee on Children and Families. During my first term in the legislature, I had opportunities to be Vice-Chair of the Committee on Children and Families and Co-Chair of the Speaker’s Task Force on Foster Care. The committee has historically been an outstanding example of the bipartisan solutions that are developed when we all work together and I am dedicated to continuing that bipartisan collaboration in this session of the legislature.”
