Dear Governor Evers,

Imagine that you live with a roommate, and you discover that they leave the apartment unlocked at night. You respectfully ask them to lock the door at the end of the day, but you discover that they not only refuse to lock the door but also leave the door wide open, despite repeated requests. How would you feel if one day, you discover your possessions stolen? Or even worse, how would you feel if a visiting friend loses their life to an armed burglar? Every one of us would feel that the roommate was negligent and responsible for what occurred.

This is what happened in Waukesha. Our “roommate” in Milwaukee, District Attorney Chisholm, has repeatedly left the door open and unlocked due to his lax bail policies. The result of one such case was the tragic deaths of six people and a grieving Waukesha community. His repeated negligence deserves to be investigated for the safety of the people of southeastern Wisconsin, many of whom live in communities neighboring Milwaukee County. These communities cannot participate in the decision to remove Chisholm through a vote, and they are looking to you to act in this matter.

We believe that there are enough facts to warrant an investigation, and we have encouraged citizens to file a verified complaint so that you cannot continue to hide behind technicalities. By refusing to pursue an open investigation, you are leaving the citizens of Southeastern Wisconsin vulnerable and unprotected from future harm as a result of Chisholm’s destructive policies.
