**Majority Leader Fitzgerald Acknowledges Evers' Statements on Schools**

**[Madison, WI]** — Republicans in Wisconsin have been pressuring Governor Tony Evers to not block in-person instruction at schools that choose to move forward with that option this fall. [In an interview](#), Governor Evers told reporters that he had no plans to mandate virtual learning for the upcoming school year. Senate Majority Leader Scott Fitzgerald released the following statement in response:

“I appreciate the governor’s statements that support in-person instruction, but actions speak louder than words. Earlier this spring, the governor flip-flopped on whether to issue a stay-at-home order. He flip-flopped on whether to move the April 7<sup>th</sup> Election. I’m fearful that he will cave to pressures from liberal groups and backtrack once again.

“The fight isn’t over yet, and legislators will remain vigilant. I would urge citizens of Wisconsin who support in-person instruction to keep the pressure on the governor.”
