Mayor Cory Mason Announces Details of Smart Cities September Series

Series includes conferences, events, and announcements that will reclaim Racine’s historical brand as “Invention City”

City of Racine – Today, Mayor Mason joined with County Executive Jonathan Delagrave, UW-Chancellor Debbie Ford, Gateway Technical College President Bryan Albrecht to announce Racine’s first ever Smart Cities September Series. This has been an incredible year for Racine’s Smart Cities efforts, including successfully competing against over 100 municipalities from Canada, Mexico, and the United States to become Wisconsin’s first Smart City and the smallest municipality ever designated in North America. Now, just over 100 days after achieving the designation, the City of Racine is ready to announce three events we are calling the Smart Cities September Series.

“I am excited to announce our Smart Cities September Series consisting of three major events. Both the Smart Cities September Conference and the Smart Cities Readiness Workshop are designed to educate and engage with both the public and our private partners around what Smart Cities are and how Cities can improve the lives of their residents through the use of technology,” said Mayor Cory Mason.

“Our third event is a celebration of innovation. Racine was at one point branded “Invention City” because we had more patents per capita than any other city in America. The Racine Innovation and Technology Gala will highlight the innovation that we know continues to this very day in our City. Companies such as SC Johnson, InSinkErator, Twin Disc, Modine, and Foxconn continue to be on cutting edge of innovation in their respective sectors. The Gala will be a celebration of the legacy of innovation, both past and future, in our community,” continued Mayor Mason.

- The nominee must be: a business entity with at least one (1) physical site in operation and one (1) or more employees located in the City of Racine or Racine County.
- The physical and/or digital product(s) or service(s) must have become commercially available to end users for lease or purchase for the first time between January 1, 2016 and July 30, 2019.
