He explained his three-point approach to building a work force, which included partnering businesses with higher education facilities to train the next generation of manufacturers; breaking down barriers to employment, such as helping those with physical and mental disabilities and those with drug addictions to find jobs; and recruiting people from other states to move to Wisconsin to work."

'Five months in a row of sub-three percent unemployment. Wages are at a higher growth than they are nationally.' Walker encouraged those in attendance to talk to friends, co-workers and neighbors and remind them that before he was elected, 'when Democrats controlled everything, unemployment was a 9.3 percent. Many jobs were lost and graduates were moving to other states to find work,' he added."
