## College Goal Wisconsin Helps Students and Their Families with FAFSA

Wausau, WI -- Since 2006, over 22,000 Wisconsin students have received free help completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at College Goal Wisconsin events held throughout the state. Financial aid professionals and other educators volunteer at the event to help students and their families complete the FAFSA.

Anyone who is planning to pursue a postsecondary education in the 2018-19 academic year should complete the FAFSA. The FAFSA is the form that must be submitted in order to be considered for federal and state financial aid including grants and loans. Students pursuing a postsecondary education in 2018-19 can complete the FAFSA beginning October 1, 2017.

Forty-three College Goal Wisconsin events will take place between October 4 and November 8. The events will take place on the following dates: October 4, October 9, October 11, October 16, October 18, October 23, October 25, November 6, and November 8. In addition to getting professional help completing the FAFSA, attendees will have the opportunity to enter a scholarship drawing.
