Deputies Arrest 8 in Operation Drive Sober **OWI-4th; OWI-drugs rollover crash** **1991 Repeat Offenders Since January 2010**

Milwaukee, WI – Sheriff Richard R. Schmidt continues an aggressive Operating While Intoxicated (OWI- drugs and/or alcohol) initiative to rid the Milwaukee County freeway system of intoxicated drivers. This past weekend's Operation Drive Sober initiative from Friday at 4:00 p.m. through 6:00 a.m. Monday, resulted in the arrest of ten drunken drivers. The average PBT test results were .16.

Two repeat offenders were arrested: Sherri Lorimer, age 55, of Milwaukee, for felony OWI-4th offense; and German Flores, age 24, of West Allis, for OWI-2nd.

Six first-time offenders were taken into custody: Nickolas Rincon, age 33, of Caledonia, was arrested for OWI-1st/Heroin, a felony; Daniel O'Brien, age 29, of Brookfield; Benjamin Beck, age 24, of Franklin; and Milwaukee residents Alonzo Bryant, age 18; Victor Rubalcava, age 23 and Jacob Zambrano-Rodriguez, age 27.

On Friday, September 21, at 6:15 p.m., deputies responded to a rollover crash on I-43 southbound in the Plainfield curve. The driver was trapped in the Dodge pickup truck and was in and out of consciousness. The Milwaukee Fire Department extricated the subject and administered Narcan, which revived the man.

Nickolas Rincon admitted to snorting heroin while driving, and had heroin on his person. He faces a felony charge of Possession of a Narcotic Drug, punishable by up to 3½ years in prison.

OWI-4th

On Saturday, September 22, at about 2:30 a.m., a deputy working a speed saturation noticed that a vehicle's trunk was not secure and initiated a traffic stop on I-94 eastbound near 27th Street. The driver showed signs of intoxication, and tested a .10 on a PBT. Sherri Lorimer, age 55, of Milwaukee, said she drank "one big beer." Lorimer was arrested for OWI-4th offense. Her prior convictions were in April 1993, May 2009 and December 2009. She has a .02 BAC restriction on her license. If convicted of this OWI-4th offense, she faces up to six years in prison.
